FROM THE PRESIDENT

May I open my first report of 2022 by wishing all members and staff a very warm, although somewhat belated, happy New Year. I hope everyone enjoyed some relaxing times with family and friends over the festive season and that we are now all refreshed and ready to deal with whatever challenges COVID may throw at us over the next 12 months.

On that note, in case anyone missed my note a few weeks ago I confirm that as per the latest WA State Government mandate, as of 31 January 2022 all Members and guests must provide proof that they have been double vaccinated before they can enter the Clubhouse. In addition masks must be worn at all times within the Clubhouse except when eating or drinking, which I hope Members won't find too problematic given the quality of the Clubs' food and wine offerings!

Club Member, Dr Clay Golledge, has more than 25 years of consultant experience as a Physician in Infection Management and Clinical Microbiology. His highly respected views on the current COVID crisis have been extensively reported in all forms of the media. At this Topical Interest Lecture Members and guests will be afforded an opportunity to learn first hand from Dr Clay Golledge on the likely "road map" for Perth in the months ahead and participate in an interactive Question and Answer session.

He was also instrumental in setting up the inaugural Infectious Diseases Service at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital.

WA HISTORY INTEREST FORUM

A PLACE TO GROW: THE CENTENARY OF ST MARY'S ANGLICAN GIRLS SCHOOL GUEST SPEAKER: RICHARD OFFEN MONDAY 28 MARCH 2022

Members and guests are invited to subscribe to an address by Richard Offen on "A Place to Grow the Centenary of St Mary's Anglican Girls School 1921-2021" at a WA History Lunch on Monday 28 March 2022.



Richard Offen is a historian, lecturer, broadcaster and overall champion for Perth. He first visited our city in 2001, saying it was love at first site so to speak. The weather, open space and greenery within our city are no comparison to gloomy UK and its wet weather, from where Offen originates.

Working with Heritage Perth, he aimed to put the expression "Perth has no history" to bed and Richard continues to educate the people of Perth's Heritage through his books, "Lost Perth" and "Perth Then and Now" and speaking about places and organisations and their

contribution to Perth history and its environs.

Richard also researched and authored the centenary history record of St Mary's Anglican Girls school titled "A Place to Grow." Although Richard is now retired, he says he is busier than ever and will continue to promote Perth and its abundance of history.

St Mary's Anglican Girls' School was founded when two small private girls' schools operating in West Perth, Mrs Blanche Gouly's Girls' Grammar School and Miss Emily Hilfirty's Alexandra High School, amalgamated. The school opened on 14 September 1921 with an initial roll of 98 boys and girls. The school relocated to a parish hall at 40 Colin Street, West Perth.

Having outgrown the parish hall and West Perth by 1964, a building appeal was launched to buy and then develop the present campus at Karrinyup. Under the guidance of the then Principal, Anne Symington (1965–1982) and Peter Atkins (Board Chairman) St Mary's operated in both West Perth and Karrinyup until 1970, when the entire school relocated to Karrinyup on 40 acres of land, which when purchased was a remote wilderness block of mostly desolate coastal sandhills.

In recent years numerous additions have been made to the campus, including The Lady Wardle Performing Arts Centre, The Lady Treatt Centre for Music and Dance, The Sir Thomas Wardle Swimming Pool Complex, two gymnasiums, a new library and boarding facilities with a capacity for 200 students.

Since 2005, the St Mary's Anglican Girls' School Foundation purchased 200 acres (80 ha) of land in Metricup, which is located in the Margaret River Wine Region, to develop its flagship outdoor education facility, St Mary's at Metricup. The property contains two dams, two large pastures, an airstrip, a vineyard, an eco-tent camping area permanently set up for up to 100 students, dormitory accommodation for 115 students and staff together with a heritage hand sawn timber clad cottage.

This is a story not to be missed, as it follows the vision and determination of so many contributors over 100 years to simply make this place one of the finest schools in Australia and as a place to grow.

NEW ART GALLERY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ROOF TOP PRIVATE TOUR WITH THE GALLERY DIRECTOR WEDNESDAY 30 MARCH 2022

Members and their partners are invited to subscribe to a private tour of the newly opened rooftop of the Art Gallery of Western Australia hosted by the Gallery's recently appointed Director, Colin Walker. A dinner at the Club House will follow the tour dinner during which the Director will speak about his vision for the Art Gallery in the years ahead.

In November last year the ten million dollar transformation of the rooftop of the Gallery was officially opened and recognises the completion of the original architectural intention for the 1979 design building, which was imagined by architect Charles Sierakowski as a vantage point for looking out. The new rooftop area includes an interior gallery, an outdoor sculpture walk, a bar and a 34 metre contemporary Aboriginal art piece by Christopher Pease.

The Director, Colin Walker, is originally from Liverpool and took over the directorship of AGWA in 2019, initially in an acting capacity and very recently in an official capacity. Prior to this Colin Walker held senior roles in the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries. programs. During his address at dinner he will share his vision to use the Gallery's full range of assets to make it fully sustainable, including having a strong music and performing arts program.

The evening will commence with Members and their partners assembling at the Club House for a short coach transfer to the Gallery at 5.30 pm. After a welcome by the Director of the Gallery a tour of the new rooftop will ensue with drinks service throughout.
