### WA HISTORY INTEREST GROUP FORUM - NOTE NEW TOPIC HMS HOOD: THE BRITISH BATTLECRUISER GUEST SPEAKER: CLUB MEMBER NIGEL ROGERS MONDAY 27 JUNE 2022

We would like to inform Members that Mr Boyd Peters who was going to speak about the History of the First Pipe Organ in Western Australia has to defer his address due to commitments overseas. However, we are pleased to advise that Members and guests are invited to subscribe to an address by Club Member, Nigel Rogers, on the HMS Hood: The British Battlecruiser which visited Fremantle and Albany 98 years ago during 1924 at a WA History Lunch on Monday 27 June 2022.



The presentation by Nigel Rogers will cover the entire history of HMS Hood from its construction through to its eventual loss at the Battle of the Denmark Strait in May 1941. The 1924 'Empire Cruise' of HMS Hood will also be covered in detail, which included port visits to all major Australian cities, including Fremantle in February 1924, ninety-eight years ago.

"It was eighty-one years ago, that the British Battlecruiser HMS Hood and the German Battleship Bismarck fought what was, arguably, one of the most famous surface engagements of the Second World War. In an instant on the morning of May 24th

1941, the Royal Navy lost the symbolic flagship of its fleet and 1,415 crew who were on board, with only three survivors. The Battleship Bismarck, which would have otherwise had an interesting but unremarkable history, was transformed into one of the most well-known ships of the war. In much the same way that the loss of the Hindenburg brought a spectacular end to the era of the airship as a credible flying machine, the loss of the Hood marked the end of the Battlecruiser as a credible fighting machine." - William J Jurens - International Naval Research Organisation.

### ART GALLERY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ROOF TOP PRIVATE TOUR WITH THE GALLERY DIRECTOR WEDNESDAY 29 JUNE 2022

Members will recall the tour to the Art Gallery of WA had to be postponed due to COVID restrictions. We are now pleased to inform Members and their partners that the Club has been able to reschedule this event for Wednesday 29 June. The evening will commence with a private tour of the recently opened rooftop of the Art Gallery of Western Australia hosted by the Gallery's new Director, Colin Walker. A dinner at the Club House will follow the tour dinner during which the Director will speak about his vision for the Art Gallery in the years ahead.

In November last year the rooftop of the Gallery was officially opened and recognises the completion of the original architectural intention for the 1979 design building, which was imagined by architect Charles Sierakowski as a vantage point for looking out. The new rooftop area includes an interior gallery, an outdoor sculpture walk, a bar and a 34 metre contemporary Aboriginal art piece by Christopher Pease.

The Director, Colin Walker, is originally from Liverpool and took over the directorship of AGWA in 2019, initially in an acting capacity and very recently in an official capacity. Prior to this Colin Walker held senior roles in the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries. programs. During his address at dinner he will share his vision to use the Gallery's full range of assets to make it fully sustainable, including having a strong music and performing arts program.

The evening will commence with Members and their partners assembling at the Club House for a short coach transfer to the Gallery at 5.30 pm. After a welcome by the Director of the Gallery a tour of the new rooftop will ensue with drinks service throughout.
