THE USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES & PHOTOGRAPHY By-Laws 14 & 19

To assist with everyone's enjoyment of the Club House, Members are reminded to ensure that any guests are informed in advance of the following By-Laws pertaining to the use of electronic devices and photography.

Electronic Devices

Except as provided in By-Law 13 b) the use of electronic equipment, such as mobile telephones, tablets, laptops, and other computer devices is restricted to bedrooms, the first floor Reading Room and Sitting Room together with the adjoining outdoor balcony, provided that such use does not impair the use or enjoyment of those areas by other members. Mobile telephones may also be used at the telephone table in the entrance hall provided for that purpose.

Elsewhere in the Club House electronic diaries may be used for the purpose of arranging social arrangements in the same way as pocket diaries and calendars are used, provided they are switched to silent mode; tablets may be used in the Verandah Room at breakfast time to access news and newspaper sites, but headphones, ear-phones and microphones may not be used; otherwise electronic equipment may not be used for any purpose.

No member or their guests shall take photographs in the Club without the permission of the Secretary being first obtained.

ANZAC DINNER Dining President – Group Captain Dr Barney Cresswell RFD Thursday 20 April 2023

Dining President, Grp. Capt. Dr Barney Cresswell RFD is pleased to announce that Flt. Lt. James Pears, who is currently serving at Pearce Airforce Base, has accepted his invitation to be the Guest of honour at this year's ANZAC Dinner on Thursday 20 April 2023.

Educated at Scotch College, Perth, Flt. Lt. James Pears joined the RAAF in 2002 and graduated with Wings in 2004 and continues to serve in the Australian Airforce. Subsequently posted to RAAF Edinburgh to fly the AP-3C Orion for what would become a near decade long commitment to Middle East operations. Flt Lt. Pears completed three tours to the Middle East operating overland across Iraq and in the North Arabian Gulf and North Arabian Sea before also undertaking multiple overseas exercises and operations in Southeast Asia, border protection operations in northern Australia and exercises as far afield as Scotland, South Korea and the United States of America. Was then fortunate enough to be in the first group of RAAF pilots to go to Jacksonville, Florida to train on the P-3 aircraft replacement, the P-8 Poseidon and then served for two years as a flying instructor embedded in the USN.

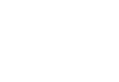


Flt Lt Pears returned to Australia in late 2016 with the first RAAF P-8 to establish Australian P-8 Training school at 292SQN, RAAF Edinburgh before elected to return to Perth as a long term specialist aircrew role at 2FTS, Pearce. Served as Flight Commander for the first pilots' course on the PC-21 aircraft and is currently employed in 2FTS Standards Flight developing junior instructors.

With submarines a very topical issue in Australia, Flt Lt. Pears will share his experiences in the art of submarine hunting while flying the P-3 Orion and the P-8 Poseidon aircraft, which are now routinely deployed to the South China Sea. Flt. Lt Pears will also share some of the interesting flights he has undertaken over the years that have coincided with ANZAC Day and what 'going to war' means in today's RAAF.

The evening will commence with pre-dinner drinks at 7.00 pm for dinner at 7.30 pm (sharp). Dress is mess dress or black tie with medals. Members and guests may also wear their father's or grandfather's decorations on their right lapel.

ART ACQUISITION Allon Cook

The Club recently acquired at auction the oil painting *St George's Terrace* by well known Western Australian artist Allon Cook (1907 – 1971).



Born in 1907 Cook attended the Fremantle Technical School and Perth School of Art and in 1931 he was elected a member of the West Australian Society of Art. Predominantly a landscape artist Cook also painted shipping and harbour scenes and urban night scenes. He won the Hotchin Prize for oil paintings in 1950, 1951 and 1958, the year he painted *St George's Terrace*. Cook is represented in the National Gallery of Australia and the Art Gallery of Western Australia as well as in numerous regional and private collections.

St George's Terrace is an evocative image of the Terrace during the 1950s before the 1960s economic boom forever changed the thoroughfare.
