FROM THE SECRETARY

The number of reciprocal club bookings for the club's bedrooms has grown exponentially in recent months and it is now not uncommon for all the bedrooms to be booked over several nights each month. I encourage Members wishing to book a bedroom to do so as soon as it is known to them that they require a room rather than leaving it to the last minute. A reminder that the tariff that applies for a standard bedroom remains only \$120 plus GST per night, which is exceptional value for accommodation in the centre of Perth. A free parking bay in the parking garage is also provided for the duration of the stay.

The Club is currently working with Exchange Tower's management team to extend access to "vehicle number plate recognition" technology to Members. This will require Members to register vehicles they request be identified by the number plate recognition system and to authorise the Club in writing to provide that information to a third party to do so. This technology will enable Members who subscribe to avoid having to lean out of their vehicle windows with their access cards at the entry point to the parking garage. Be on the look out for a dedicated flyer with a subscription form from the Club before the end May.

Finally. the weather has changed quite suddenly in recent days and with cold nights setting in can I suggest nothing better than a warming cocktail or a single malt whisky and some hot bar food from the new Bar Cocktail Menu List in front of the fire in the Garden Drawing Room.

Peter Gago last presented the wines of Penfolds at a dinner in 2018 and currently the only event he is flying into Perth to host during his visit.

Peter Gago is graciously making parcels of 2018 Penfolds Yattarna Chardonnay together with 2009 Penfolds Grange and 2017 Penfolds Grange from his museum collection for the dinner. This is in addition to parcels of 2013 Penfolds Bin 389 and 2016 Penfolds St Henri from the Club's reserve cellar.



Having joined the Penfolds winemaking team in 1989, in 2002 Peter became the fourth ever Chief Winemaker for Penfolds and is one of the most internationally recognised winemakers in the world.
