#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Gentlemen, if you feel strongly enough about a candidate that you are prepared to vote against them becoming a Member of the Weld Club, then you have an obligation to your fellow Members to make your concerns known to the President. Part of the role of the President and the Committee is to listen to and resolve any concerns, and Members can have confidence future Presidents and Committees will treat this aspect of their job as seriously as I do.

Gentlemen, it has been a privilege and an honour to serve as your President for the last two years. As my term draws to a close I would like to thank Secretary Hugh and his staff for their unwavering support. They are the ones who make this Club the wonderful place we all enjoy so much. I would like to sincerely thank my fellow Committee-men and the Members of all the Sub-Committees for their tireless contribution and diligence. And I would mostly like to thank all my fellow Members for making my time as President such a pleasure.



# THE SAVILE CLUB LONDON New Reciprocal Club in London

Located at 69 Brook St in fashionable Mayfair the Savile Club is a distinguished gentlemen's club features a dining room with a Michelin-star chef, snooker room, drawing room, library, outdoor terrace and twenty well appointed bedrooms. Initially known as the New Club in 1927 the club moved to its present home at 69 Brook Street in Mayfair, a Grade II listed historic town house built with leases granted by the Duke of Westminster in the mid-1720s. The building was formerly the home of "Loulou" Harcourt, 1st Viscount Harcourt, a Liberal Party cabinet minister.

As a gentlemen's club, the Savile members are known as Savilians and the Club's motto of Sodalitas Convivium implies convivial companionship. In the Victorian period, the Savile was known for its freedom of conversation and conviviality. The club has no political affiliation and nowadays embraces an eclectic membership, where artists, scientists, politicians, diplomats, officers, industrialists, and journalists socialise without bias or inhibition. Reciprocal Members and their guests are asked to dress appropriately for this setting and a collared shirt and jacket are always required with ties optional. The use or display of mobile phones is strictly forbidden in any of the public rooms or on the terraces, except in the designated area, bedrooms and rooms hired for private business meetings.
