IMPORTANT - PAYMENT OF SUBSCRIPTIONS Effective from 1 January 2024

At the beginning of the pandemic as one of the many measures introduced by the Committee, Members were afforded the option of paying their annual subscription in monthly instalments. The Committee has now determined that pursuant to Club Rule III 7. subscriptions for Ordinary Members will revert to be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year and this will take effect from 1 January 2024.

In acknowledgement that for some Members the payment of subscriptions monthly may still be convenient, the Committee has agreed that a Member may "opt out" of this reversion to half-yearly instalments and continue to pay their subscription by instalment each month.
