FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members

One of our Club's greatest amenities is its beautiful lawn and gardens. These features of the Club now represent a unique "green space" in the city and we are very fortunate that those members who contributed to the redevelopment of the club's land in 1991 had the vision to create this oasis. The grounds were the stage for two outstanding club events in March. Firstly, the annual Long Table Lunch for Members held on 15 March 2024 and later the End of Summer Party on 23 March, when 160 Members, partners and friends gathered for fine food, wines and fellowship. Both events were absolute highlights during one of the most pleasant times of the year for outdoor events in Perth.

During March the Committee hosted a reception to thank the many interest group conveners who volunteer their time to provide a wide variety of participation opportunities for Members. There are now 19 interest groups with engagement by Members across the groups growing from 860 in 2014 to 1,800 in 2024. Attendance at interest group events now accounts for approximately 20% of all Club attendance and I take this opportunity to publicly thank those conveners who play a vital role in the life of the club. If you are motivated to join one of the interest groups I invite you to reach out to our Interest Group Co-ordinator, Kirsty Kelly, to learn more information about the activities of each group.

As the range of unique Club events continues to expand, you will see featured later in this newsletter that on 1 May, Members and their partners will be afforded the opportunity to have an after-hours private tour of "Another Time, Another Perth" art exhibition at the City of Perth Council Building. This private viewing will be followed by the opportunity to return to the club for dinner, during which the curator of the exhibition will speak to the collection. What makes this event unique is that no less than twelve works of early Perth scenes, from the Club's art collection, have been provided on loan for the exhibition, testimony to the depth and quality of our art collection. I thank the Art Sub-Committee Chairman, Ben Luscombe, for his vision and energy in staging what promises to be a wonderful event.

Another very important date in the Club diary is of course the ANZAC Dinner on Tuesday 23 April 2024. Dining President, Tony Wills, has arranged for Commodore Brett Dowsing JP, RAN (Retd) to speak and this is a serviceman who has had an incredible career, including commanding the Australian Air Force Marine SAR Section and Seahawk Helicopter Squadron. The dinner is open to all Members and gentlemen guests together with women who are currently serving, or have served, in the Australian Defence Force. I invite you, the next time you are in the Club House, to pause in front of the Honour Board in the entrance hall adjacent to the staircase and reflect on those Members who gave their lives in service for our country.

Finally, I am delighted to see the overwhelming response to the launch of our Wine Appreciation Evenings, "The World of Chardonnay", set for Tuesday 16 April. Through the Wine Subcommittee, chaired by Des Thompson, we have a wealth of wine experience and knowledge. Given the prominence of our wine program at the club, it is our objective to provide a uniquely accessible opportunity for members and partners to ground their wine appreciation journey in a technical understanding of key wine characteristics, grape varieties, regions, producers and vintage ratings. These evenings, beginning with broad educational aspects and progressing to explore the great wine regions of the world, represent exceptional value and a wonderful opportunity for member and partner engagement.

Walking Program:	We are planning a series of tree top, botanic, waterfront, foodie and nature trail walks. The program will cater for different walking levels and grades.
Accommodation:	Tanglin Club, Steven's Road Singapore.
Food Program:	Thursday night gets underway with pre-dinner drinks at the Club followed by dinner at the Club's famous Cantonese restaurant Tang Yun. We will dine at a combination of Hawker style settings and restaurants, including a food walking tour over the four days.
